

Conservation Report Joe Hovious and James Belden

2009 Chapter Conservation Projects

- 1. Spring Youth Day at the Pratt Center in New Milford
- 2. US Fish and Wildlife Service grant for data collection and analysis on Deep Brook
- 3. Placement and retrieval of temperature monitoring probes in various streams in the Chapter's area
- 4. Fall sampling of macroinvertebrates in Deep Brook, Pootatuck, Pond Brook and Halfway River in cooperation with CT DEP and the Town of Newtown
- 5. Completion of the Wildlife Habitat Improvement Program (WHIP) project on upper Deep Brook near Dickenson Park in Newtown
- 6. Completion of the WHIP project on trhe East Aspentuck River at the Pratt Center in New Milford
- 7. Analysis and reporting of data from 2007 and 2008 projects

This fall, we set out to explore several steelhead fisheries to determine if they warrant a CVTU-sponsored trip in the future. Messers Hovious, Rekart and Whipple fished Eighteen Mlle Creek and Cattaraugus Creek in October; Messers. Hovious and Whipple were scheduled to fish the Maitland and Niagara Rivers in November; Gary Whipple is fishing the Salmon River in December. We got washed out of the Maitland, but the other three streams are all lovely fisheries worth revisiting. As a result, we have a CVTU-sponsored trip to the Cattaraugus in November 2009.

For those of you who are not yet familiar with steelhead, they are migrating rainbow trout on steroids. In the case of the streams above, the fish live in the Great Lakes for 1-3 years after being born in a river, and then return to spawn in the same river, much bigger and stronger.

The photo below was taken of a Niagara River steelhead caught on a white streamer using an 8 weight rod and sinking line. The Niagara is big, fast, cold river full of steelhead, lake trout, smallmouth bass and muskies. In two days our explorers caught about 30 steelhead and lake trout from a motor boat; the largest fish was almost 14 pounds. Because the river is moving so quickly, it doesn't freeze over, and it can be fished all year long. Gary Whipple is going back in January or February if anyone doesn't mind a little cool weather and has the itch to join him for a couple of days of swinging streamers on a sink tip line for winter steelhead.

Last month's article dealt with "the most dangerous times of the year; Christmas and spring vacations". We were lucky this year, only one school had a problem. They lost power for a week-end and lost all but four fish. A second school had earlier lost all of its fish, but that was a water problem requiring a complete cleaning, change of water and a restart to the bio-system in the aquarium. Both of those schools will be restocked this month and ready to restart the academic program by mid-February.

We are already planning release dates and sites, and working with the DEP to assure the stream site is approved for the trout we are releasing. The releases are the culmination of the program and the students look forward to this all year. We usually have an event with the release and the students either bring their lunch or the teachers will grill hamburgers and hot dogs. The mentors will bring fly rods and introduce the students to casting and for many it is the first time they have ever been in a trout stream. They have an opportunity to hold the invertebrates they have studied, see the minnows and crawdads and frogs, and observe a real trout stream. If you would like to join us, please call me and I will set you know when there is a release in your area.

2008-2009 Trip and Classes Calendar Gary Whipple

Trips:

The 2009 calendar for CVTU-sponsored trips is complete. There is a May trip to fish for brown trout in central Pennsylvania, a June float trip on the Deerfield River in Massachusetts to fish for rainbows, an October float trip to fish for landlocked salmon and brookies on the east branch of the Kennebec in Maine, and a trip to fish for steelhead in western NY. Alert: The Deerfield and Kennebec trips have early signup deadlines. Anglers must sign up for those two trips in particular before the end of December 2008. Only the number of rafts that have been reserved by anglers who have made their deposits on the trip will be retained; the remainder of the 5 boats for each trip will be released in early January. The blocks of rooms will also no longer be reserved after January 15.

As of November 13, the status of the CVTU-sponsored trips in 2008-2009 is:

May trip to Penns Creek and the Little Juniata in central Pennsylvania: 4 of 9 seats still available

June trip to the Deerfield in Massachusetts: 7 of 10 seats still available

October trip to the Kennebuc in Maine: 5 of 10 seats still available

November trip to the Cattaraugus in western New York: 1 seat still available

To reserve a seat, send in your deposit check and registration form (in case of a tie where two people each reserve a seat, the postmark date/time on your deposit check submission will determine priority). A waiting list of 2 or 3 names will be accepted once the trip is filled, and persons on the waiting lists will fill any cancellations.
