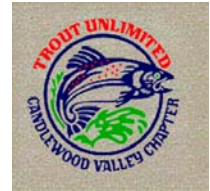

Collectable Corner for the Banquet Eugenia Mierisch

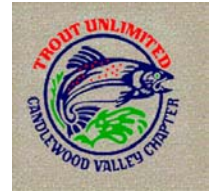

SPEAKER'S FORUM

Have you ever lain in bed at night pondering the secret life of the average, every day "riffle dwelling benthic micro-invertebrates", or the differences between an ephemeroptera and a trichoptera? Well, put away your sleeping pills because our March speaker is Mr. Mike Beauchene of the CT DEP. Mike is the Volunteer Monitoring Coordinator of the Rapid Bioassessment in Wadeable Streams and Rivers by Volunteer Monitors (RBV) Program. Mike will be here to explain a little bit about the program and his duties and responsibilities at the DEP.

All over the State of Connecticut small groups like CVTU have been taking Mike's course on micro-invertebrates, learning about their habitat, environment and life cycle, then taking that knowledge to the stream to collect, identify and catalog the "bugs" for further lab work at the DEP.

For the fly fisherman there are additional benefits in the knowledge we gain from the micro-invertebrates. It is directly transferable to the stream. The "bugs" we collect are the same ones we try to replicate in the flies, both nymph and dry, that we tie to the end of the tippet.

Join us Tuesday, March 14 and enjoy Mike's presentation. By the way, ephemeroptera are mayflies and trichoptera are caddisflies. For additional information, check the websites.

Try this fly

I'll be tying up some of these for "bucket items at the Banquet. This is a great fly, I've had good success with it in Montana and in local rivers. I use it as the first nymph (it's heavy and sinks the rig faster) and a smaller dropper nymph tied on to a piece of tippet 12+ inches long (I tie it to the Copper John eye so the hook is better available to the fish). The fish hit the Copper John as often or more often than the dropper, but this offers the trout two sizes and patterns of flies. In Montana, used it in a hopper/Copper/dropper three-way as recommended by its originator, John Barr.

I tie them in several colors of wire (green, Chartreuse, red, wine). If you don't have thinskin, use other dark nymph case material (or use cut strips of polyethylene baggie material coloring the underside black with a permanent marker - I've done this with clear thinskin which is flexible vinyl, I think). Go to the website below and see the details of each tying step. The method of applying the partridge legs is the easiest/best way I know to get the legs the right length and look on a nymph. This is a terrific site to see patterns and learn how to tie and use them (click on the "Tutorial" details)

Copper John (John Barr)

Hook: TMC 5262 #12-18 (2XL, heavy hook)

Thread: Black 70 Denier,

Bead: Gold colored Brass or Tungsten, sized to hook. (and a few wraps of lead wire for additional weight up against bead if you really want to get it down in faster water—the web site shows this and I tie mine that way)

Tail: Dark Brown Goose Biot

Body: Wapsi UTC Wire, Color of Choice, sized to hook.

Flashback: Pearl Flashabou

Wingcase: Black Thinskin

Thorax: Peacock Herl

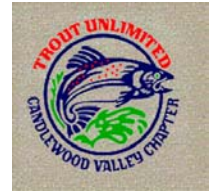
Legs: Hungarian Partridge

Wingcase Coating: 5 Minute Epoxy

Talk about fishing and share your pictures on CVTU's website

We've recently added two new functions to our website -- a discussion forum and a photo gallery. These new tools provide an online meeting place for TU members and those interested in our chapter's activities. Web site is: www.cvtu.org

A place to talk

The discussion forum is a place where we can have discussions about fish, fishing, gear, conservation and practically any other topic (within reason) that our members find interesting. The great thing about a discussion forum is that many people can participate in the discussion without all having to be online at the same time. Each discussion thread is saved and visible to others. You can come and reply to a topic already posted or post your own topic to start a new thread.

Two helpful functions available on the forum is the "Watch this Forum" and the "Watch this Topic" functions. These functions send you emails when there is activity on the forum or topic that you're watching. Each Forum (e.g. Find a Fishing Partner, Fisher Reports, etc) can be watched for new topics. And each Topic can be watched for replies. There is a link below each forum and topic that allow you to toggle the "watch" function on and off. This is a very handy function if you aren't visiting the forums regularly.

A place to share photos

The photo gallery is just that -- a place where members can share photos of their fishing activities. You can either post in the topic related galleries (e.g. Deep Brook & Pootatuck, Saltwater, etc) or you can post in your own photo album in the gallery. Photos are limited to 512KB in size so you'll have to resize any that are larger. You'll find a link in the FAQ to a free utility that resizes photos.

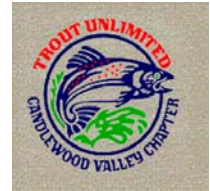
Registration Required -- it's fast and easy

In order to post your comments and pictures both the forum and the gallery require registration. The process is fast and easy. On the Discussion Forum, select "Register" from the top menu bar and fill-out the form. On the Photo Gallery, select the "Register" link at the top of the page and fill out the form. The Photo Gallery requires one more step in order to register. You must click on the link in an email that the gallery will send to the email address you included in your registration. Once you click on that link your account will be active.

Privacy Assured

While registration does require an email address, to ensure your privacy, the forums and gallery are set to hide your email address. The email address is only used by the system to either validate your registration or send you messages when you're watching a forum or topic. So, your personal information is not visible to users or spammers.

Congratulations to John Kumisky, as he has his fishing store back up and running at the same location. Stop in and see the progress and say hello to John.

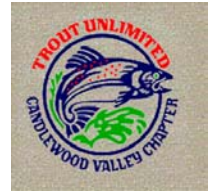
Compleat Angler Store has Moved

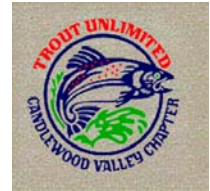

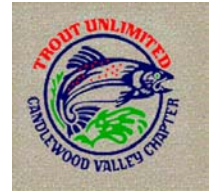

Connecticut Political Action Call

Fellow CVTU Members:

By now you know that grassroots political action works – just look at the Housatonic. We continue to have chances to positively affect water issues but we must exercise our obligation to speak out to those in political and regulatory positions who make the decisions.

This first note from me urges you to speak out on Connecticut House Bill 5277 (HB 5277).

Background:

In 1982, when the first Connecticut water permitting statutes were created, most of the big users such as golf courses, nurseries, ski resorts, municipal and private water companies, and even the University of Connecticut, were grandfathered.

Last year, groups like ours were successful in pushing for stream flow standards to protect life in our rivers. The standards apply to all State waters without exception, regardless of who is taking the water. However, there is no mechanism for DEP to deal with these grandfathered users. HB 5277 gives the DEP that ability.

Impact:

The Shepaug, the Quinnipiac, and the Fenton have suffered devastating impacts from these withdrawals which are called “*registered diversions*” During last years drought UCONN withdrew so much water from the Fenton watershed that the river went dry for 2000 feet and caused the largest fish kill (8000) in recent memory. They had other options.

Action:

Write or email any or all of the representatives below, include the co-chairs. Add your own legislator as a copy if you can (see Jerry Rekart’s list of representatives in this newsletter). Use your own words, but say you want HB 5277 to pass. You want *registered diversions* to come under the stream flow regulations.

You can make a big difference.

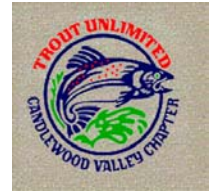

Youth:

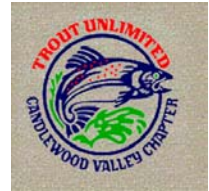
-Aid and funding for CT DEP's SEARCH program at Newtown HS.

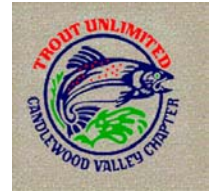
